

Color Run FAQ's

Q: Does PurColour Celebration Powder stain?

A: **PurColour Celebration Powder** can stain cloths and the skin. Typical machine washing, with stain remover, removes the stains. We recommend 'blow out' stations, (ie leaf blower stations) where the participants can get excess powder blown off before they leave the event. Removal of excess powder is recommended before applying any water. Normal liquid dish detergent and/or de-greaser will remove PurColour Celebration Powder from paved areas. Power washers also assist in the removal of powder from paved areas.

Q: What are PurColour Celebration Powder (color powder) ingredients?

A: Corn Starch Food Grade, Calcium Carbonate Food Grade, Sodium Bicarbonate Food Grade TFF, and one or more of the following colorants; FD&C Blue #1 Lake, FD&C Blue #2, FD&C Red #40 Lake, D&C Red #7 Calcium Lake, FD&C Yellow #5 Lake, FD&C Yellow #6, Iron Oxide and Ultra Marine Blue

Q: What are PurColour Neon/AfterDark color powder ingredients?

A: Corn Starch Food Grade, Calcium Carbonate Food Grade, Sodium Bicarbonate Food Grade TFF and non-toxic pigments. Pigments are free of the following chemicals: Formaldehyde, Heavy Metals, AZO Compounds, Perfluorooctanoic Acid, Aromatic Amines, Regulated Phthalates, Bisphenol A (BPA), Polyaromatic Hydrocarbons, SVHC Chemicals, and California Prop. 65 Chemicals.

Q: Is PurColour Celebration Powder environmental friendly?

A: PurColour Celebration Powder, Neon/AfterDark powder is environmental friendly. No ecological hazards are associated with this product. It can be easily washed or blown from event areas.

Q: Wondering how to get color powder off of your skin and hair after the run?

A: Follow these instructions:

- Dust off or blow off as much powdered paint as possible before you jump in the car or plop down on your white sofa!
- Color powder washes right out! Just take a shower, grab a bar of soap and some shampoo and you should be set! In our warehouse we use Dawn dishwashing soap to wash out the colored paint – it seems to do the trick on washing it out of skin.
- If you have light colored hair – sometimes the colors can have a little bit more staying power! It will wash out in a few days. We say wear it loud and proud! But if you have prom the next day and you don't want blue streaks in your hair, then you may want to wear a hat or try oiling your hair with Coconut oil before the race.

Q: Wondering how to get color powder off of your skin after the run?

A: It's nothing a tumble through the washing machine won't take care of! Powder washes out of most clothing but since we haven't tested every fabric under the sun you may want to leave your favorite running clothes or evening dress at home.

- Dust off or blow off as much powder as possible before washing. You may want to wash your color branded gear separately in cold water. If it doesn't wash out the first time, don't put it in the dryer and try some stain remover or bleach (white clothes only) the second time around.
